Child Safety	<ul> <li>Be familiar with and comply with the College's child-safe policy and code of conduct, and any other policies or procedures relating to child safety.</li> <li>Assist in the provision of a child-safe environment for students.</li> <li>Demonstrate duty of care to students in relation to their physical and mental wellbeing.</li> </ul>	
Professional Development	<ul> <li>Be open to professional development in your area of work.</li> <li>Be open to researching areas of interest relevant to directions provided in the school's strategic plan.</li> <li>Continue to develop ICT skills on platforms to support work.</li> </ul>

1. Commitment to Catholic Education	A demonstrated understanding of the ethos of a Catholic school and its mission.

Education and Experience	<ul> <li>Qualification in music or equivalent experience.</li> <li>Recognised expertise as a music instructor in one or more instruments.</li> <li>A minimum of Certificate 2 in First Aid is essential (The College will provide this training if necessary).</li> <li>Desirable:</li> <li>Experience working in an education environment.</li> </ul>	
4. Demonstrate excellent interpersonal skills, including the ability to work with people of all ages, in particular the student body and members of the College Community.	Ability to build professional and positive rapport with staff and students.
